

Plant the **RIGHT** Tree in the **RIGHT** Place

Trees beautify our neighborhoods, and when planted in the right spot, can even help lower energy bills. But the wrong tree in the wrong place can be a hazard...especially around power lines.

Be Safe! Always call 811 to locate any buried utility lines before you dig.

Do not plant within 20 feet of power lines. **NOTE:** Trees over 25 feet that grow into the pruning zone within 10 feet of poles may eventually need to be removed completely.



Small Tree Zone
Trees with a mature height of less than 25' should be planted at least 20' from lines.

ex: Dogwood,
Japanese Red Maple

Medium Tree Zone
Trees with a mature height of 25' - 40' should be planted at least 40' from lines.

ex: Bradford Pear,
Crape Myrtle

Large Tree Zone
Trees with a mature height of 40' or more should be planted at least 60' from lines.

ex: Pine, Oak, Hemlock,
Leyland Cypress
