Plant the RIGHT Tree in the RIGHT Place

Trees beautify our neighborhoods, and when planted in the right spot, can even help lower energy bills.

But the wrong tree in the wrong place can be a hazard...especially around power lines.

RECOMMENDED SMALL-SIZED TREES


Height/spread of 15-25 feet, such as:

- American Smoketree
- Crapemyrtle
- Fringetree
- Hawthorn
- Mexican Plum
- Rusty Blackhaw
- Wax Myrtle (Southern Bayberry)
- Carolina Buckthorn
- Desert Willow

- Goldenball Leadtree
- Possumhaw (Deciduous Holly)
- Texas Persimmon (Chapote)
- Yaupon Holly
- Mexican Buckeye
- Prairie Flameleaf Sumac
- Texas Redbud

Do not plant within 20 feet of power lines. When planting within 20 feet is unavoidable, use only shrubs and small ornamental trees with a height/spread of no more than 25 feet.

NOTE: Trees over 25 feet that grow into the pruning zone within 10 feet of poles may eventually need to be removed completely.
